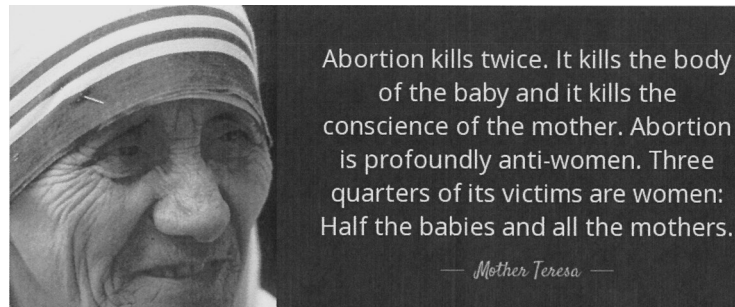

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

Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Profession of Faith - Nicene Creed




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Invitation to Prayer and Preface Dialogue
